Academic Matters:

- The conference is designed to provide opportunities for dynamic speakers both from Indonesia and beyond to join with colleagues and share their ideas and research based around the central themes of "Tradition" and "Modernity" in a multidisciplinary setting. Every speaker is expected to bring his or her academic and personal expertise to the mix.
- As this is an international forum, the language of the conference is English. We encourage those with a range of proficiency in the language to participate.
- All presentations are 20 minutes plus 10 minutes for questions. We expect all presenters to strictly respect this time schedule.
- Depending on the host university and number of presenters there may or may not be several parallel sessions. The speakers will be grouped into matching sub-panels on different aspects of the central theme, to be determined by the committee.
- The use of PowerPoint is considered helpful but not obligatory.
- During the selection procedure all abstracts are considered anonymously by the committee.
- Unless under exceptional circumstances, all presenters are expected to hold a Master's degree or higher.

* Participants:

There is a small conference fee, to be determined by the host university, for participants. To promote accessibility, there will be a cheaper rate for students. * Speakers:

There are no conference fees for speakers, with facilities being generously provided by the host university / Sebelas Maret University. Unfortunately, this also means that there will be no remunerations or subsidies of any kind. Speakers are advised to make their own arrangements regarding accommodations.
